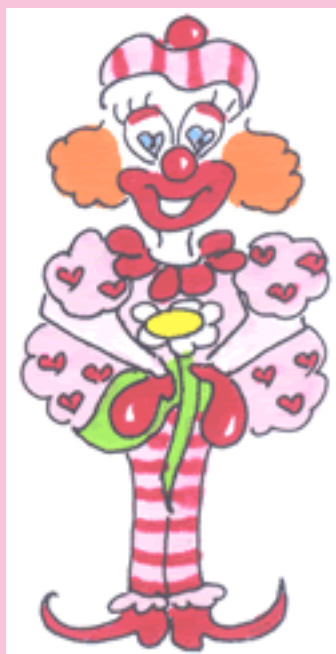

Who would have thought that a simple piece of kitchen foil could be turned into such a special Valentine's Day card!

You will need:

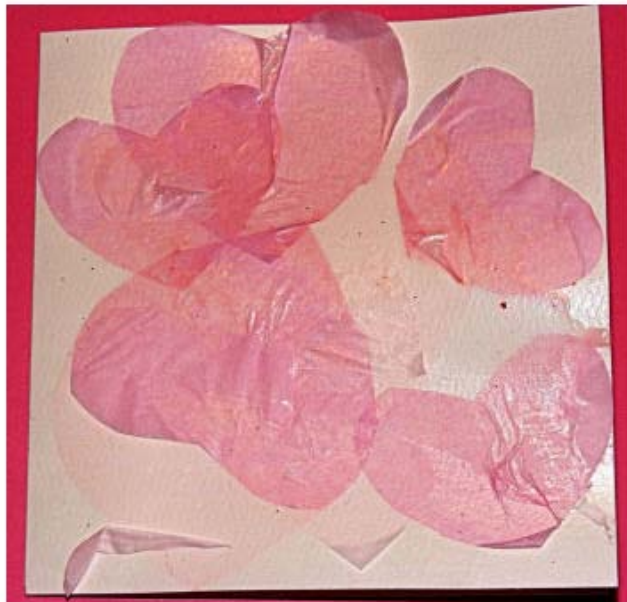
Piece of kitchen foil
Newspaper
Thin paint brush
Glue
Card blank

Instructions:

Lay your kitchen foil shiny side down on a folded newspaper.

With the end of your paintbrush, and pressing firmly, draw your design on the foil. Take care not to press too hard or you will rip the foil! Achieving the right level of pressure may take some practise.

Trim around the outside of your design and the glue it, shiny side up, to the front of your card blank.



Suitable for the youngest kids, this is messy cutting and sticking fun!

You will need:

Tissue paper hearts in more than one shade and different sizes (use our using our [heart templates](#) to cut them out if you like)

Card blank

Glue

Instructions:

Paint the front of your card with glue.

Stick on your hearts layering up and adding more glue if necessary.



This is a good card making technique for kids to use for all sorts of occasions. We have made a flower card, but you could use a heart for Valentine's Day, a Christmas tree for Christmas, and so on.

You will need:

Fancy paper or card (we used glittered card but you could use holographic, patterned whatever you have in your craft box)
Hole punch (flower, heart, Christmas tree etc)
Card blank
Glue

Instructions:

Punch out some shapes from along the edge of your card.

Cut a rectangle of fancy paper the height of your card and a few centimetres wide.

Glue the rectangle to the back piece of your card. Trim any overhanging edges.

Cut out a shape from the fancy paper to match your punch. Glue to the front of your card.


